MIGRATING MONARCHS

Monarch Butterflies (*danaus plexippus*) are an essential component of our eco system, in addition to being our state insect, they are also crucial pollinators in the process of propagation our plant species. Monarchs are a migratory species that travel over 3,000 miles from Canada to Mexico. One path of migration is known as the I-35 corridor and flies right over UT Dallas! Our particular location and means give us a certain responsibility to protect and provide for these vulnerable species that we depend on for so much of our pollination. In order to do so the Office of Sustainability and Grounds Department have maintained our two certified Monarch waystations and are proud to have two more certified waystations on campus this fall




GREEN BUILDING: Alumni center

With the completion of the new Davison-Gundy Alumni Center, UT Dallas's campus has added yet another green building to our map. The building cleverly captures and repels natural sunlight where appropriate to aid heating, cooling, and lighting space. Each room in the building has window

access to the outside, welcoming in sunlight and warmth, decreasing the amount of electricity needed for these tasks. The white roof helps reduce cooling costs and the campus's heat island effect by repelling unwanted sunlight. In addition, almost all of its lights are LED, which require significantly less electricity and maintenance than traditional lights.

COMPOST CONNECTION: organix

Recently, UT Dallas has partnered with an off-campus composting facility. Organix, to streamline our current composting operation into a more efficient process. The new operation works with dining services to collect pre-consumer food waste from Dining Hall West, Parking Structure 3, and the Student Union. While previously, the oncampus composting operation could only collect plant material (fruits, vegetables, and landscape waste), the new partnership allows UT Dallas to collect meat and dairy products as well. As for the on-campus site, everything on site will continue to be processed into compost for UT Dallas's landscapes. Additional compost for campus andscapes will be obtained from Organix, once on-campus operation has been completed.



- Facilities Management / Sustainability Office
 - Organix Recycling
 - Facilities Management and Dining Services have partnered with Organix Recycling to collect all pre-consumer food waste from the DHW, PS3, and SU loading docks.
 - Organix takes the material to their compost site in Hutchins, Texas
 - FM staff and eco reps visited the site and received a compost tour. This provided insight into the composting process.
 - Integrated Pest Management (IPM) Plan
 - Facilities Management has been developing and updating our IPM plan.
 - This outlines pest control practices at UT Dallas.
 - This plan will be applied to 100% of UT Dallas.
 - Sustainability Roundtable
 - The Office of Sustainability will be hosting a get-together with sustainability staff, eco-reps, and student representatives from various campus organizations and clubs to discuss how to become involved in "green" initiatives and activities oncampus.
 - This meeting will take place on Wednesday, October 4 at 8:30 AM at FM.
 - Sustainability Newsletter
 - The Office of Sustainability has developed an October newsletter.
 - The newsletter can be seen on page two of the agenda.

- AASHE STARS
 - AASHE is the Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education.
 - The AASHE Conference is taking place October 15-18 in San Antonio.
 - There are speakers, tours, an expo, poster sessions, and scheduled presentation sessions.
 - This event includes a student summit and student registration rates.
 - There is interest from Student Government in having representatives attend this and/or next year's annual conference.
- Sustainability during the Semester
 - There is a variety of sustainability related activities going on in the upcoming months.
 - The recent volunteer event called Butterfly Flutterby at the Monarch Waystation resulted in over 1,500 gallons of weeds being pulled.
 - This Friday, the OSV will host the Adopt-a-Highway event to clean up trash around the Bush Tollway.
